

In Merritt's memory, the award was established for a school district or an individual who is recognized for taking a professional risk for the greater good of Mississippi public schools.





#### Dr. Kim Benton

Dr. Kim Benton served as Mississippi's interim state superintendent from July 2022 until January 2023. She worked in public education in Mississippi for 40 years as a teacher's assistant, teacher, principal, executive director of special populations and federal programs, interim superintendent of Mississippi's School for the Deaf and Blind, and Mississippi's Chief Academic Officer. Dr. Benton was instrumental in helping to lead the state's successful education reform efforts. Dr. Benton's unfaltering allegiance to our MS Public Schools created a safe space for students and faculties to work and grow over the past 6 months. Her courage to see us through to the next chapter has been greatly apparent and appreciated.

Dr. Cena Holifield has worked with Mississippi Legislators to codify standards that benefit the education of students with dyslexia. These standards include the components required for dyslexia therapy training programs, the credentials of a dyslexia therapist, and the requirement for early dyslexia screening. Her professional mission includes meeting the needs of children with dyslexia through providing a model dyslexia school, training dyslexia therapists, and providing outreach to schools. Her work with the Science of Reading has gained national attention, and her tireless efforts have made a difference in the lives of many students.





Following the realities Covid brought her and her students' way, Mrs. Lucas instilled an "I CAN" attitude in her students and inspired and collaborated with them to create the Passing with Proficiency and Growth Plan (PPG). The purpose of their PPG Plan was to instill a positive mindset as they prepared to "Pass the test, hit Proficiency, and show Growth" on the Spring 2022 state assessment. The result? They achieved the top math scores in the State!

In the words of Mrs. Lucas, "Positive mindsets enhance positive outcomes." She and her students made history. Mrs. Lucas shared, "Nothing is more satisfying to a teacher than seeing the smiles on your student's faces when they realize how proud everyone is of them." She is adept at helping students to overcome challenges and achieve academic goals."

Dr. V is a tireless advocate for her students, school, and community, as evidenced in her and her fellow educators' efforts to initiate a combination parent and community outreach plan that allowed for a revote and eventual passing of a school bond issue to support \$8.75 million of improvements at her school.

Before starting the Law and Public Safety Program at Southeast High School in August 2019, Mr. Watson was a professional firefighter and arson investigator for the Meridian Fire Department. This depth of experience, commitment to service, and love for community fills Mr. Watson's classroom and impacts his students' motivation, community engagement, and academic achievement.

Mr. Watson "walks the walk" with his students. He is the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Shooting Sports Club, and Skills USA sponsor; leads incorporation of instruction and awareness of human trafficking through a pilot program in partnership with the MS Attorney General's Office/Mississippi Bureau of Investigation/and Lauderdale County Sheriff's Department; facilitates students in volunteering at the local volunteer fire station; is enrolled alongside his students in an Emergency Medical Responder/Emergency Medical Technician Class; and is currently in the process of adopting one of his students.
